Cynthia K. Morris Hill, “Cindy,” a Special Education Teacher and long-time resident of Laurel, MS, passed on March 4, 2020 at the age of 59.

Cindy was a devoted mother and a faithful friend. Teaching special needs students was truly her passion and she considered her students her own children. She enjoyed attending and participating in church activities at Salem Heights Baptist Church, including teaching Arts and Crafts in Vacation Bible School each summer. During football season, you could find her cheering on the Mustangs at a tailgate with family and friends. She will be deeply missed by her family, friends, and all who knew her.

Our last year of college we finally got into a college course together: tennis! We had sooo much fun!

Her precious soul will live on in my heart, and I am and will deeply miss Cindy forever. I loved her to pieces, and through her I love her family. Due to circumstances beyond my control, I cannot make it to her funeral, and for that I am truly, truly sorry.
