Nancy Parker Ford, born July 14, 1941, passed away at her home on February 21, 2019 at the age of 77.

Mrs. Ford graduated from Gulfport High School, Perkinson Junior College and Ole Miss, and held a master's degree in history. She was retired from the Social Security office after 42 years of service.
