Rev. A. W. Ishee, 88, of Laurel went home to be with His Lord and Savior on Thursday, June 28, 2012.

Funeral services will be held at 2 p.m. Monday, July 2, 2012 at Memory Chapel Funeral Home in Laurel.

Rev. Ishee was founder and pastor of the First Pentecostal Church of Laurel for 41 ½ years. He was a veteran of World War II and an ex-prisoner of war. He wrote a book, *Stalag IV-B* detailing his experiences. He loved to tell his story to church groups and schools.

He was preceded in death by his parents, Amos Winfred and Daisy Ishee; his brother, Paul E. Ishee; his sister, Katherine Bishop; and granddaughter, Julie Culpepper Luker.

He is survived by his wife of almost 67 years, Norma E. Baggett Ishee; three daughters and sons-in-law, Janet and William "Bill" Culpepper of Laurel, Kathy and Rev. Allen Shortridge of Meridian and Joanna and Chris Buffington of Petal. He is also survived by one grandson, Stephen Culpepper and great grandchildren, Andrew Luker, and Nathaniel, Bethany and Tori Culpepper. He was a loving husband, father, pastor, and friend. He will be sorely missed. He was a true model of a soldier for Christ.
