Bridget Lovette, 62, was born May 2, 1962, in Baton Rouge, Louisiana. She passed away on October 4, 2024, at her residence in Laurel, Mississippi.

She loved being a mother to her two daughters and a great wife to Harold, but her favorite title was Nana. She was known for her spoiling mentality. She

lived her last few years in a great effort to see her “babies,” as she called them, grow and move to the following stages of their lives. She and Harold would make annual trips to Montana to see the grandbabies and spend time attending their big moments. She loved giving and getting hugs from all her grandbabies. She was known to have a spirit of adoption, as she would often refer to children as her grandbabies who weren’t and adults as uncles or aunts who weren’t blood-related. But blood was never the requirement to be family; only a requirement of a desire to be loved and cared for.

Her father, John Lewis, and sister, Meryl Jacobs, preceded her in death.

She is survived by Harold Lovette, her husband of thirty-nine years; her daughters, Brinkley Landrum (Chad) and Larissa Lambert (Jeffery); her grandchildren, Carter Landrum, Carsyn Landrum, and Carrington Landrum; her sisters, Judy Fry, Pamela George-Smith, and Ann Lewis; and her mom, Audrey Lewis.
