John Charles "Chuck" Perry, 61, of Hattiesburg, formerly of Laurel, died Tuesday, September 21, 2010 at his residence.

Funeral services will be held at 2 pm Sunday, September 26, 2010 at Providence Baptist Church on Eatonville Road in Forrest County with burial in the church cemetery. Rev. Manning Minton will officiate. The body will be placed in the church at 1 pm Sunday.
