



Rev. Ernest Edward "Ed" Bullock

December 9, 1934 - July 24, 2012

Edward Bullock, retired United Methodist minister passed away peacefully at his home in Laurel on Tuesday, July 24, 2012. He was born and raised in Jones County and attended Trevecca Nazarene College in Nashville, Tennessee and Nazarene Theological Seminary in Kansas City, Missouri. In earlier years Rev. Bullock pastored in the Church of the Nazarene in Mississippi, Ohio, Kentucky, Michigan, and Florida. The last years of his ministry were with the United Methodist Church including churches in Stringer, Old Bay Springs, Seminary and West Laurel.
