Harlon Randolph Walters, 81, of Laurel went to be with his Lord and Savior on Saturday, September 10, 2016. Services will be 10 AM Wednesday September 14, 2016 at Memory Chapel with burial to follow in Florence Cemetery. Visitation will be Tuesday September 13, 2016 at Memory Chapel from 5 to 8 PM. Rev. He will be remembered as a loving husband, father, grandfather, brother, church leader, and friend. His sense of humor has been shared by all who knew him. A strong Christian man, he was an avid bass fisherman, golfer, and Roy Rogers fan. He was a Master Carpenter and member of the U.S. Air Force. Before retiring from the 186th Air Refueling Group of the Air National Guard, he achieved the rank of Tech Sargent as Crew Chief of an RC135 Stratotanker. He took great pride in being an active Mason of the Clyde Howard Masonic Lodge 525. As a Shriner, Harlon drove the Shriners' Van for many years, transporting hundreds of children to the Shriners' Hospitals for Children in Shreveport, LA, and Galveston, TX. He was known as "Papaw" to those children.
