Barney Myrick, a cherished husband, father, grandfather, great-grandfather, and dedicated community member, passed away, leaving a legacy of love and service. Preceded in death by his parents, Ola Hill Myrick and John Willis Myrick, his sisters, Ora V. Myrick, Violet Myrick Shows, Irma Myrick Johnson, and his brother, Glaston W. Myrick. Barney is survived by his devoted wife, Gloria McDuffie Myrick, daughters Cynthia Myrick and Linda Myrick Muse (Kenny), granddaughters Amy Carter, Laura Holloway (James), and Chelsie Lozada (Daniel), and great-grandchildren Samantha Carter, Owen Carter, Wilder Holloway, and Beckett Holloway, along with many nieces and nephews.

Barney was a man of honor and dedication, graduating from Heidelberg High School and serving his country in the Navy during the Korean Conflict aboard the USS Owen. He was a 32nd Degree Mason and was active in the local Masonic Lodge (W.E. King Lodge) and Shrine, both York-Rite and Scottish-Rite.

He was a man of community, founding Heidelberg Pump and Supply Company, serving the area for 35 years. He was a Board Alderman of the town council, and Honorary Deputy Sheriff, and he was a founding member of Heidelberg Academy and served on the board for 17 years (14 as Chairman).

He was a man of faith, a devoted believer of God and a lifetime member of Heidelberg Baptist Church, where he served on every committee and sang in

the choir for many years. He was a man of music, playing the piano, guitar, drums, and steel guitar, and was a member of several bands, including “The Original Sundowners.”

Most of all, Barney was a man of family. He married the love of his life, Gloria Jean McDuffie in 1956, and together they built a home and legacy for their children and family. Barney lived his life for those he loved, and one of his greatest joys was telling stories and playing music surrounded by friends and family. His love, service, and community spirit touched many lives.
