Mrs. McCarty was born May 30, 1914 in Copiah County to the Rev. George Smith and Nina Smith. She graduated from Sandersville High School in 1933. Mrs. McCarty was a resident of the Erata Community for 67 years and a longtime member of Erata Presbyterian Church and later United Presbyterian Church in Sandersville. She was active in Women of the Church. She is currently a member of First Trinity Presbyterian Church. She was a member of the Order of the Eastern Star and the Home Demonstration Club.

When she was young, she was a seamstress at Reliance Manufacturing Company. She was employed by the Jones County Health Department for many years until her retirement in 1977. She has lived in Hopkinsville, KY for the past 9 years due to declining health. She died at Christian Health Center in Hopkinsville from the complications of aging.

She was preceded in death by her husband, Hugh McCarty in 1992 and an infant daughter, Evelyn Gay McCarty in 1938.
