February 4, 1948 - August 28, 2021

Ronnie L. Smith Sr., 73, of Heidelberg, MS passed away at South Central Regional Medical Center in Laurel, MS on Saturday, August 28, 2021.

He was born February 4, 1948 at Watkins Memorial Hospital in Quitman, MS. He was the oldest of ten siblings and attended Zach Huggins High School in Quitman, MS.

Ronnie served in the U. S. Army during the Vietnam War. He was awarded two purple hearts and numerous medals for his bravery after he was shot during a fire fight with the Viet Cong. He was a faithful member of Corinth Baptist Church in Heidelberg.

Ronnie is survived by his wife of 35 years, Liz Myrick Smith, who he often referred to as the “love of his life”; three sons, Ronnie L. Smith Jr. of Brandon, MS, Brad Myrick (Alison) of Gardendale, AL, and Shawn P. Myrick (Monica) of Ellisville, MS; one daughter, Sandi Reeves (Tony) of Petal, MS ; and seven granddaughters, Gabriel Rule, Jaina Crawford, Mary Grace Myrick, Katie Myrick, Halle Myrick, Kendall Wicker, and Blair Wicker. He is also survived by seven siblings, Jo Ann Bishop (Bill), Johnny Smith, Jack Smith (Dot), Linda Dunnam, Ricky Smith (Suzanne), Cindy Schrock (Kurt), and Sam Smith (Angie); numerous nieces and nephews; and his beloved poodle, Pappy Jake.

Ronnie was preceded in death by his parents, Thomas and Elizabeth Smith; brother, Donnie Smith; and sister, Judie Bounds.

A graveside services will be held at Corinth Baptist Church Cemetery, 321 County Road 33, Heidelberg, MS 39439 on Thursday, September 2, 2021 at 10 a.m. Bro. Jamie Matthews will officiate. The family asks loved ones to practice social distancing and wear masks during the service.

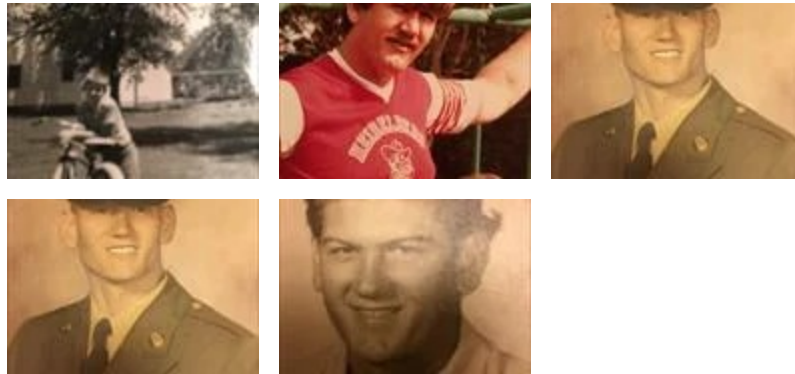

“ Ronnie Lavoid Smith became the “man of the family” on Mar. 18, 1961 when our dad was killed in an auto accident. That meant he had a lot of responsibility. He was the “father figure” to our youngest siblings. He was a war hero & inspired me to carry on the family tradition of serving in the Army like he did & our dad before us. Of all our siblings, I have the longest history with Ronnie. He made the mistake of teaching me to play baseball when I was 4 yrs. old. That means I was a really tough baseball player!
