Reverend Stephen E. Tillman, 77, from Soso, Mississippi passed from this life on July 16, 2019 at Forrest General in Hattiesburg after a lengthy illness. He was born September 6th, 1941 in Mobile, Alabama to his mother Mrs. Elizabeth McClintic.

He was preceded in death by sisters Janice and Patsy, brothers Bobby, Jerry, Gramp. He is survived by his brother Larry.

He was also preceded in death by Marion's parents, Lawrence and Myrtle Ingram of Soso who were his parents for 60 years.
